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A Construction Manager (CM) plays a pivotal role in creating the built environment that we live in. Their job is to turn a concept into a reality. They influence strategic decisions to guarantee the successful delivery of projects, working with architects, quantity surveyors and developers.

The industry currently has a shortage of qualified construction managers. Their versatile skillset makes them a critical member on construction project teams. The demand for CMs has increased average salaries, even for those in trainee positions.

The course provides students with core construction and management skills. These unlock a wide range of diverse opportunities for graduates. Students could pursue roles that manage large scale commercial developments, lead bespoke residential projects or even strategize procedures to improve construction sustainability. No matter which route each CM chooses to take, the globally recognised qualification and learned skills ensure future career growth.

As part of the qualification, you will study 8 modules across 2 years:

Year 1:

- Construction Technology
- The Construction Environment
- Digital Applications for Construction Information
- Measurement & Estimating

Year 2:

- Construction Design Project
- Tender & Procurement
- Legal & Statutory Requirements in Construction
- Legal & Statutory Frameworks in Quantity Surveying

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Any of the following:

- A BTEC Level 3 qualification in Construction and the Built Environment (or a related subject)
- Four GCSE Grade 4 (formerly Grade C) or above including Mathematics and English or equivalent
- Other related Level 3 qualifications
- An access to Higher Education Diploma awarded by an approved further education institution
- Related work experience
- An international equivalent of the above

COURSE FORMAT

Teaching sessions are delivered one day a week, either virtually, or in-person. Most students are able to complete the workload within their 'college day'. The course can be completed independently, through company sponsorship, or as part of an apprenticeship. Make an application to discuss which delivery and funding option is the best fit for you!

PROGRESSION

The Level 4 Higher National Certificate provides a route to other Higher Education courses. This includes Higher national Diplomas (HND) bachelor degrees. Many students take the opportunity to enrol with our University Partners, progressing to the third year of a part-time degree courses, which result in a BSc (Hons).

The HNC course kickstarts the journey to post graduate courses and memberships to professional bodies such as **CIOB** and **RICS**.



SOFTWARE ACCESS & TRAINING

The college hold licences with AutoCAD and Bluebeam Revu. The course content includes step-by-step guides for both software. Students are given annual subscriptions.

For all higher education programmes, access is given to the Microsoft office suite. Students will develop their abilities with Excel, Word and PowerPoint.

WHAT DOES IT COST YOU?

The cost of your qualification is funded by the employer and government.

HOW LONG WILL IT COST YOU

- 2 years plus 6 months EPA.
- Attend our Poole Campus 1 day a week.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To enrol as an apprentice, the college requires that you:

- Meet the entry requirements for the course
- Over 16 years old
- Live in the UK
- Not already in full time education
- Employed

*Apprentices without level 2 English and Maths will also need to achieve this level prior to taking the end-point assessment.

BALANCING WORK & COLLEGE

You will attend college for a full day once a week. The rest of your week will be with your employer. The apprenticeship therefore allows you to earn a wage, fast track your learning and gain a qualification.

FOR EMPLOYERS

The Construction Site Supervisor Apprenticeship is an excellent way to bring new skills to your business and further develop employee talent.

The Level 4 Higher National Certificate in Site Supervision, delivered as part of the apprenticeship, provides a broad introduction to construction and different construction management functions. This develops and strengthens core skills while preparing students for specialist subjects at Level 5 or to progress with the qualities necessary for job roles that require some personal responsibility.

TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT

Students benefit from learning both on and off the job. Apprentice off the job training will primarily be on their weekly college day. Students will complete the HNC alongside various apprenticeship requirements.

The final stage of the apprenticeship is completion of an End Point Assessment (EPA). Students are independently assessed to ensure they have developed the necessary skills, knowledge and behaviours. Students are supported by BPC and their employer throughout their studies. The apprentices, employer and college representative must agree they are ready to progress to the EPA.

FUNDING AND INCENTIVES

- Government funds 95% of the course fee*
- £1,000 employer incentive available to businesses employing apprentices aged 16 to 18

EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS

The apprentice will need to be employed for a minimum of 30 hours a week and will attend college once a week.
